Description

Challenging behavior can sometimes interfere with daily routines and a family's ability to fully engage in community activities. This workshop will provide families with tools to help determine why (the function) challenging behaviors occur as well as several strategies that families can implement within the home and within community settings. Tips will be discussed regarding how to collaborate with professionals so that interventions can be carried out across settings (e.g., at school and work sites).

Kathleen M. Feeley, PhD is a Professor in the College of Education, Information, and Technology at LIU Post. She is also the Founding Director of the Center for Community Inclusion, which is home to several grant projects. Dr. Feeley's research focuses on examining the use of behavior analytic intervention to address the phenotypic weaknesses and build upon the phenotypic strengths associated with Down syndrome and other developmental disabilities.
